

Statement of Purpose

North Metro Child Development Center is an integral part of the ministry of the church, serving the community, as well as the congregation. The school is here to assist in sharing the Gospel of Jesus Christ to families in our community by providing a Christian based preschool education with age appropriate lessons that help children develop the social and learning skills necessary to be successful at home, at Church, and at school. We do this by augmenting standard education lesson plans with the teaching of God's word through Bible stories, scripture memorization, children-involved "hands on" ministry, evangelistic singing programs, and through the loving mentorship of Christian teachers.

The CDC/CK will hold Clip On Classes on Wednesdays. These classes will be open to all the four year old and older classes. In addition, outside companies will provide ballet and play ball for three year old's and older. Periodically throughout the year, children in the three year old classes and older will have the opportunity to stay and play for an extended hour.

CDC Exciting Events will include Dad's & Donuts, Fire Truck visit, Pumpkin Patch, Costume Parade, Charlie Brown Thanksgiving Feasts, Pajamas & Pancakes, Character Shows, Mother's Day Tea, Special Singing Programs, and many more. A monthly calendar will be given out with more details.

Our 2021-2022 program will begin Wednesday, September 8 and the last day will be Thursday, May 19, 2022. The registration fee is non-refundable, non-transferable, whether you move, change schools, or withdraw for any other reason. Your registration fee must accompany your form. There is no activity, book, or curriculum fee. You will be contacted in August regarding teacher and room assignment.

Children's Morning Out
(must be 1 year-old by 9/1/2021)
Tuesday/Thursday 9:00-12:00

The Children's Morning Out (CMO) program is designed for children 12 to 24 months old. Our goal is to provide a loving and safe Christian environment where your child can create, discover, learn, and play through activities and daily routines. Our core curriculum will center on biblical topics as well as other early childhood themes. Children will learn how to transition between activities and how to stay on a routine.



Two-Year-Old Program
(must be 2 years old by 9/1/2021)
T/TH, MWF or M-F 9:00-1:00



Our two-year-old program is designed to introduce children to numbers 1 through 5, the alphabet (one letter is used each week), primary colors, shapes and social skills such as listening and sharing. The curriculum is covered throughout the day especially during group time in which we use songs, games, finger plays, Bible stories and other stories to teach concepts in a fun way.

Three-Year-Old Program
(must be 3 years old by 9/1/2021 and be potty trained)
TWTW or M-F 9:00-1:00

Our three-year-old program emphasizes social skills, academic skills and large motor skills. Letter recognition is taught one letter each week along with colors and shapes. Bible memory verses, crafts and cooking will also revolve around that letter. We will have a circle time each day that will include a Bible story, finger plays, songs and games. Fine motor skills will be introduced using Crayons, paint, glue and scissors.

Four-Year-Old Program
(must be 4 years old by 9/1/2021)
M-TH or M-F 9:00-1:00



Our four-year-old program is designed to prepare children academically for Kindergarten along with a foundation of Biblical values and principles. The children will memorize Bible verses each week and also learn about new and old testament Bible characters.

The four-year-olds will learn to recognize and write upper and lower case letters, be able to work patterns and learn some basic word recognition. The children will practice fine motor skills every day in gluing, cutting and writing. Every week a folder is sent home filled with school papers, crafts, conduct report and a detailed newsletter. Our program is very structured and organized.

Chapel is held every Wednesday in the Fellowship Hall for all four year old and older classes. We sing praises, recite scripture, pledge to our flags and Bible and most importantly learn Bible stories through video animation.

Parental Communication

Communication between the class teacher and parent is very important. Teachers can be reached by phone or email for any concerns or general questions. Each week a newsletter is given out that will update you with what your child has learned during the week. It will also have important dates to remember, their Bible verse they're learning, and other pertinent information. In addition, a Shutterfly account has been set up for each class with parents only invited to view pictures that were captured during the week.

Mission Projects

Our school will participate in three mission projects throughout the year. We believe children should learn at an early age about helping others in need. We will help the Lawrenceville Food Co-op in the winter and the American Cancer Society in the spring. Our fall mission project will be determined each year.

Music and Movement

Music and Movement play an important, developing role in your child's life as research has proven in many studies. In our music class, the children will learn to appreciate the art of music through a variety of activities such as playing rhythm instruments, coordination exercises, listening games and singing. The children will perform a Christmas musical and a Spring musical, which are held in the evenings.

Library

Classes will visit the library on a weekly basis. They will have the opportunity to read a variety of age appropriate books in an atmosphere that is cozy and friendly. Older classes will receive their own library card to check out books each week.
